Let the Good Times Roll
Nestled deeply south in the US state of Louisiana is a French ethnic minority known as the Cajuns. Once an isolated country people, they are now popularly known for their love of music, food, and "joie de vivre" or "joy of living".

The Cajuns originally settled in the Canadian province of Acadia, but were expelled by the English during the French and Indian war of the 18th century. (The name "Cajun" actually comes from an English mispronunciation of the word "Acadian".) Throughout the years in Louisiana, Cajuns were discriminated against for their differences. Even in the 20th century, Cajuns were treated harshly, and children were punished severely for speaking Cajun-French in school. Consequently, much of the culture faded, and the language has nearly disappeared.

Beginning in the 50s, a revival in Cajun culture began, and Cajuns went from estranged to esteemed. Cajun food, known for its seafood and heavy spices, consistently attracts visitors from neighboring states. The more popular recipes include gumbo, a heavy roux-based stew, and boiled crawfish. Boiling crawfish is usually a big event that includes large, spiced pots of crawfish and vegetables that are shared by many people – from an extended family to multiple communities.



Cajun music, particularly Cajun-influenced Zydeco, is unique enough to be a subject of study for ethnomusicologists from all around the world. Zydeco is a music typically played in 2-step or waltz time, using drums, guitar, bass, accordion, fiddle, and washboard, and traditionally sung in Cajun-French.

Although they inhabit only a small corner of the world, it's a small corner that, thanks to the Cajuns, has a lot of love for life!

"Bohemian", a term that surfaced in France in the mid-19th century, was first associated with roving Gypsies. As it became more widely used, it referred to people who preferred to lead a non-traditional lifestyle such as artists, writers, and those who had unorthodox or antiestablishment political and social points of view. Many of the greatest artists and writers of the late 19th and early 20th centuries in Europe were thought of as "Bohemians". But, it might also be appropriate to think of America's Cajuns as bohemians too! There are many similarities: Cajuns originally came from France; they were very artistic, especially musically; sought an alternative lifestyle, and loved life! Had they remained in France, perhaps many of them would be recognized today among the greatest artists of that era.

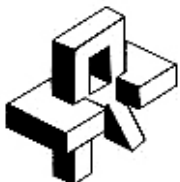
